

CIVIL WAR RECORD: PETER ANGEHR

(also appears in records as Peter Angher, Ange, Angen, and Angi)

- Nov. 21, 1864 - Enlisted as a private in 25th Regiment, New York Volunteer Cavalry, at Hart's Island, New York. Age: 31; occupation: butcher; born: "Germany"; height 5'9", blue eyes, light hair and complexion. Received \$100 bounty for enlistment.
- Dec. 17, 1864 - Assigned to "K" Company, Captain Simon E. Chamberlin. At this time, the Regiment was stationed at Winchester in northern Virginia as part of the Army of the Shenandoah under General Phil Sheridan.
- Dec. 19-28, 1864 - Major General Torbert's Cavalry Division, including the 25th New York, left Winchester to attack the rail junction at Gordonsville. Weather conditions on the march were severe. Upon reaching Gordonsville, they found it too strongly defended by Confederate infantry to attack. Skirmishes were fought at Flint Hill on December 20 and at Jack's Shop, near Gordonsville, on December 22-23. The Regiment returned to Winchester on December 28.
- Jan.-June 1865 - Skirmishes were fought at Columbia Furnace on January 19 and 29, 1865. The Regiment remained on duty in the Shenandoah Valley until June 1865.
- June 27, 1865 - Honorably discharged with the Regiment, Hart's Island, New York.
